These were <u>indigenous</u> children who were taken away from their families to grow up without their aboriginal culture and language.  This remembrance, next to the apology by Prime Minister Kevin Rudd in 2008, should be one step towards <u>reconciliation</u> .		The Australia Day is the <u>national bank holiday</u> of Australia. It is celebrated on 26th January and <u>commemorates</u> the landing of the first British settlers in Australia in 1788. The aim of a national bank holiday like the Australia Day is to <u>unify a nation</u> and to create identity.
