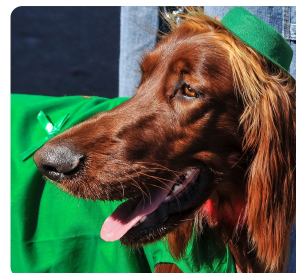


Passive exercise: St. Patrick's Day in the united states

The verb in the passive voice

For the passive voice, your verb needs two parts:

Form of "to be" + past participle

You can change the tense of the verb in the form of "to be".



Example

Active: Peter opens the window.

Passive: The window is opened by Peter.
