

Reported Speech

You use reported speech when you repeat what someone said without quoting their

Reported Speech in the Simple Past Tense:

If we want to repeat something someone said **earlier**, we need to use a reporting verb (e.g. "say"/",tell" or "ask") in the simple past. The verb in the sentence we want to repeat also needs to be changed to the simple past. To report a question, we add the word "if" which is



Rep. verb + person + simple past

Direct speech: I like her.

[Example Question:

Rep. verb + if + person + simple past

Direct speech: Do you like him?

Reported Speech of a Request:

If we do not want to report a statement or a question but a request, the reported speech is formed differently. Instead of using the simple past form of the verb in the original sentence,

Γŋ	Example	Request	(+):
----	---------	---------	------

Rep. verb + to + infinitive

Direct speech: Talk to her!

Indirect speech: She told me to talk to



Example Request (-):

Rep. verb + not to + infinitive

Direct speech: Don't worry!

Reported speech: He told me not to
