- 45 the castle at a lake inside the mountain, which destroy his castle every night. Vortigern told his workers to dig deep into
- 50 the mountain. His workers discovered an underground lake with two sleeping dragons (one red
- 55 and one white). The red and white dragon woke up and began to fight. The red dragon, which represented Vortigern's
- 60 people (British people), fought the white dragon, which represented the Saxons.
- 65 In the end the red dragon won. That is why the red dragon flies over many buildings in
- 70 Wales - as a symbol of the Welsh people. So, be careful where you roam in Wales ...remember: let sleeping dragons lie.
