Extra tips

- use colors for symbolism: certain colors are associated with specific emotions (e.g. red for anger, blue for sadness, ...)
- action poses: use dynamic poses to show movement or emotion (e.g. a figure with a raised arm/fist might show anger)
- add simple background pieces to show the setting more clearly (e.g. a tree for outdoors, a table for in doors, ...)
