

Writing a DIARY ENTRY

① First you need to know the structure of a diary entry, then read and use the useful phrases:

- **You** write it: „Ich-Perspektive“
- Watch out! Past tense!

The date of that day	1 st March 2025 2 nd October 2030 3 rd May 2010	
Greet the diary	Dear diary, - today I feel great \ bad \ terrible \ awesome \ lonely \ sad \ ... - You won't believe what happened to me today ... - Let me tell you, what happened today... - Today was a special \ weird day. \ ... the best\worst day of my life.	
Event Tell what happened	Who was with you? Today, I went ... Where did it happen? This morning, ... What did you do? This afternoon, ...	
Feelings When it happened	When did it happen? We had so much fun, when ... I can't believe that ... I was so excited to ... I felt terrible\ horrible\ strange\ I hated it, when ... weird I was really annoyed, when ... I was so angry\upset I was so nervous, but she ...	Past Tense!!
Interact with the diary	Can you believe it? Do you remember when ... What do you think? What could I have done!? What should I do now?	Present Tense!!
Feelings Now, looking back	All in all it was a great \ awesome \ fantastic \ unbelievable \ bad \ horrible \ terrible \ sad \ ... day	
Say bye!	Yours, <u>your name</u> Until tomorrow, <u>your name</u> See you, <u>your name</u>
