

Writing a DIARY ENTRY

- ① First you need to know the structure of a diary entry, then read and use the useful phrases:

- **You** write it: „Ich-Perspektive“
- Watch out! Past tense!



Element	phrases
The date of that day	<i>1st March 2025</i> <i>2nd October 2030</i> <i>3rd May 2010</i>
Greet the diary	<i>Dear diary,</i> <i>- today I feel great \ bad \ terrible \ awesome \ lonely \ sad \ ...</i> <i>- You won't believe what happened to me today ...</i> <i>- Let me tell you, what happened today...</i> <i>- Today was a special \ weird day. \ ... the best\worst day of my life.</i>
Event Tell what happened	Who was with you? <i>Today, I went ...</i> Where did it happen? <i>This morning, ...</i> What did you do? <i>This afternoon, ...</i>
Feelings When it happened	When did it happen? <i>We had so much fun, when ...</i> <i>I can't believe that ...</i> <i>I was so excited to ...</i> <i>I felt terrible \ horrible \ strange \</i> <i>I hated it, when ...</i> <i>weird</i> <i>I was really annoyed, when ...</i> <i>I was so angry \ upset</i> <i>I was so nervous, but she ...</i>
Interact with the diary	<i>Can you believe it?</i> <i>Do you remember when ...</i> <i>What do you think?</i> <i>What could I have done!?</i> <i>What should I do now?</i>
Feelings Now, looking back	<i>All in all it was a great \ awesome \ fantastic \ unbelievable \ bad \ horrible \</i> <i>terrible \ sad \ ... day</i>
Say bye!	<i>Yours, <u>your name</u></i> <i>Until tomorrow, <u>your name</u></i> <i>See you, <u>your name</u></i>
