one-syllable, ends with consonant + Vogel + consonant long

--> double the consonant + -er/-est

friendly one-syllable —> add -er/-est

irregular cases good

large two-syllable, ending in -y —> change y to i +er/-est

exciting adjectives with 2+ syllables —> use more/most

one-syllable, ends with -e —> add -r/-st big
