§ 2 Talking about future possibilities, predictions or advice - Conditional sentences, type I

A **conditional sentence** is about the future or the present. The **if-clause** expresses a condition, the **main clause** expresses the consequence.

ত We use conditional sentences, type I...

(1) ...when we want to say that **sth. will happen if a condition is fulfilled**.

(2) ...when we think it is **possible** or when we **predict** that sth will happen.(3) ...when we want to **give advice**.

(1) If you book the train tickets early, they will be cheaper. - (2) If she speaksEnglish, you can ask her for help. If he doesn't get up early, he'll miss the bus. -(3) If you go tp London, you should visit the London Eye.

2 If she speaks English, you can ask her for help.

If-clause:	main clause:
simple present	modal verb + infinitive

If he doesn't get up early, he'll miss the bus

If-clause:	main clause:
simple present	will-future

3 If you go tp London, you should visit the London Eye. If-clause: simple present modal verb + infinitive
