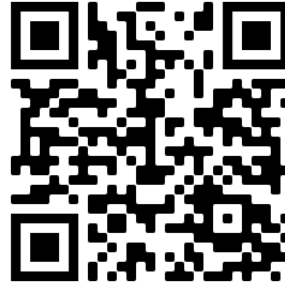


## Flipped Lessons - Are they any good?
