New York City and Its Famous Landmarks

Over 8 million people live in New York City. The city is made up of five boroughs: Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens, The Bronx, and Staten Island.

One of the most famous landmarks in New York is the Statue of Liberty. This giant statue was a gift from France to the United States in 1886. It stands on Liberty Island and welcomes visitors from all over the world.

Another well-known place is Central Park, a huge green area in the middle of Manhattan. It is perfect for walking, picnics, and even ice skating in winter. Many movies and TV shows have been filmed there.

Times Square is also a must-see. It is famous for its bright lights, huge screens, and theaters. Every year on New Year's Eve, thousands of people gather there to celebrate and watch the ball drop.

If you want to see the city from above, you can visit the **Empire State Building**. It has a viewing platform where you can look over all of Manhattan and beyond. New York City is also home to the **Brooklyn Bridge**, which connects Manhattan and Brooklyn. It is one of the oldest suspension bridges in the United States and is a great spot for photos.
