What is it?

A LEGO freeze frame is a still scene built with LEGO bricks that shows a specific moment from your chosen book. It's like pressing "pause" in a film: everything stops, and we see the characters, their actions, and their emotions in one important moment.

What do I need?

- LEGO bricks and figures

Step by step

- 1. Scene selection
- a) re-read key passages of the book
- b) choose one scene you like, e.g. because of it's importance, emotional significance, ...
- 2. Scene breakdown: identify the key elements
 - a) Who is involved? (= characters)
 - b) Where does is take place? (= setting)
 - c) What is happening? (=action)
- 3. Planning the LEGO model
 - a) decide what bricks you need (e.g. figures, a table, trees, ...)
- 4. Building the LEGO scene
 - a) arrange the bricks you chose, don't rush! try different arrangements
 - b) make sure the final version still represents the scene you chose in the beginning
 - c) take a picture of the final version so you can always replicate it
- 5. Preparing the presentation
- a) decide on how you want to present your LEGO freeze frame you could use the following questions:
- Which scene did you choose and why?
- What is happening in the freeze frame?
- How did you represent feeling or conflict?
- What does the scene tell us about the characters or the story?

Extra tips

- use colors for symbolism: certain colors are associated with specific emotions (e.g. red for anger, blue for sadness, ...)
- action poses: use dynamic poses to show movement or emotion (e.g. a figure with a raised arm/fist might show anger)
- add simple background pieces to show the settinh more clearly (e.g. a tree for outdoors, a table for indoors, ...)
