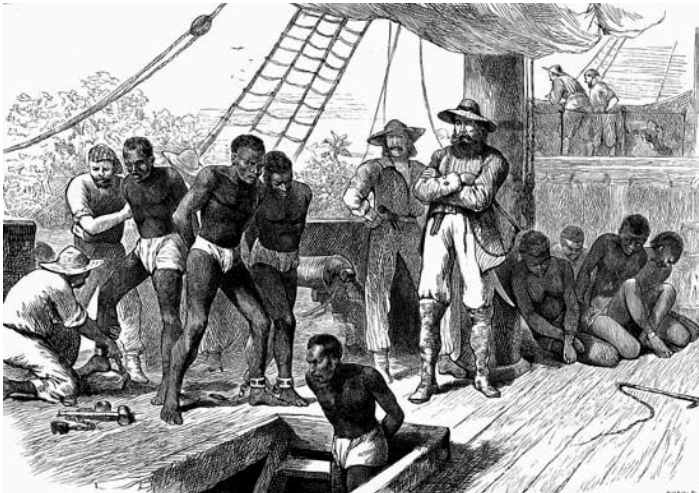




Slavery is a system, in which a person or a group of people is seen as a living possession¹. Enslaved² people were forced to work according to their 'owner's' instructions or else they were punished cruelly³. They had no human rights.

In the USA, slavery began in 1619 when 20 enslaved Africans were forcefully⁴ brought into Virginia. During the 18th century, more than 7 million Africans were taken into slavery. Many died during the horrific journeys on the ships⁵ from Africa or because of the cruel working conditions⁶.

A lot of enslaved people tried to fight back or run away. It took more than 240 years and a Civil War until slavery legally ended when the 13th Amendment⁷ to the US Constitution⁸ was passed⁹ in 1865.
